

Survey

- Questionnaire included questions on structure, resources, regulations, challenges and needs of medical committees in IF, plus a subjective evaluation of their importance
- Sent out to 62 medical chairs of IFs from <u>Interfederal-chair@fims.org</u>
- 3. First sent on 21 March, then resend two times to those that did not answer in April and May
- 4. 32 replies: approx. 50%
 - 24 Olympic IFs
 - 8 Non-olympic IFs
 - Not all IFs answered to all questions


Importance of Medicine within your Federation




